



Situate on the South side of the Frankstown Branch of Juniatta in Frankstown township, Huntingdon County
 Containing one hundred and sixty acres and thirty two perches and allowance of six per cent. Surveyed for John Jackson
 on order No. 320 dated the 1st day of August 1766

To Jacob Spangler Esq. S. G. Daniel Africa D. S.
 Thomas Weems & Others Pat'd Thomas Weems Pat'd

No. 1 represents part of the draught of a tract of land Surveyed for Thomas Weems & John Keer on Warrant dated the
 8th day of October 1774. This survey interferes twenty seven acres with the John Jackson survey. Thomas Weems & John
 Keer conveyed to John Gripe, who conveyed to Jacob Shively, who conveyed part to — Mogley the present owner the
 residue was conveyed by Shively to — Hasle whose widow and heirs now own the same, the widow married
 Dr. Baler who claims her interest. No 2 represents part of the draught of a survey made for Thomas
 Weems on Warrant dated 29th day of March 1774. This tract interferes one hundred and thirty three acres and
 thirty two perches with the John Jackson survey. Thomas Weems conveyed to John Gripe who conveyed to Chris-
 tian Yontz who devised the same to his widow & heirs. Henry Mogley married the widow and the land is now owned by
 Henry Mogley and the heirs of Christian Yontz.
