



A Draught of a tract of land situate on the West Side of the east branch of Stone Creek in Barree Township Huntingdon County Containing four hundred and one acres and one fourth and allowance of six per cent for roads & so Surveyed for William McManemy ~~dated~~ on Warrant dated the 20th September 1762 Daniel Africa D.S. To Jacob Spangler Esq. Surveyor General. The dotted lines represent part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for James Laird on Order No. 1303, dated the 20th day of September 1766. This tract interferes six acres and 118 perches with the William McManemy tract. James Laird conveyed to William McManemy <sup>Elevay</sup> tract who conveyed to Samuel Porter who conveyed to John Cree who conveyed to James Thompson who devised the same to Alex. Thompson the present owner. The same part of the William McManemy tract is included in a survey made for Michal Troy on order No. 1311 dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of September 1766 no person claims the land under this title the part marked A containing four acres is claimed by virtue of an Improvement made by John Cree in 1774. John Cree sold the same to John Barr the present owner. The green lines represent a survey made for James Benezett on order No. 46 dated the 1st day of August 1766. This tract interferes one hundred and forty six acres and sixty seven perches with the William McManemy tract. James Benezett conveyed to John Cox & Wm. Patterson who sold to Thos. Fitcher whose Exrs. sold to John W. Swift who sold to Charles Swift who sold to Wm. Cummins who devised to Robert & Charles Cummins present owners. The yellow lines represent a survey made for Stuart Bowen on order dated
