



A Draught of a certain piece of Land situate in Warren Township Franklin County containing seven acres & forty eight perches & allowance of 6 pr. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed June 28th, 1801. In pursuance of a warrant granted Jacob Zimmerman for 10 acres bearing date Apr. 2nd, 1879.

The above piece of land is claimed by Henry Brewer in right and title of Jacob John and has been cultivated this 35 or 40 years according to my best information and the dotted line represent a part of the same which I believe and am satisfied is vacant and contains 1 A 154 per. and allowance.

But Jacob Zimmerman insists upon it being all vacant going according to the patent of Jacob John. Beginning at a hickory on line of Widdow Herrods improvement and running S. 2 E. 101 rods along Brewer & Zimmerman. Mr. Brewer insist on 111 rods and Mr. Zimmerman line in right of George Brown is 113 rods but for the lines to close you must go 108 rods from the hickory corner formerly, but stone now.
