No. 1 represented by the late colored lines is a draft of a tract of land surveyed for James Johnston on warrant dated the 1st day of June 1763 this tract interferes four hundred and fifty three acres and forty perches with the Edward Evers tract James Johnston conveyed to Daniel Clark and Dr. Wm. Smith Daniel Clark conveyed to the firms of Milford and Roberts and Neate and Pegew the heirs of Milford & Roberts now claim the land Neate & Pegew conveyed to William Neate whose heirs now claim Dr. William Smith purchased the whole tract from Edward Evers and devised the same to Charles Goldsborough the present owner of the Edward Evers tract

No. 2 represented by dotted lines is part of A draft of A tract of land surveyed for William Kennedy on order No. 1367 dated the 26th day of September 1766 this tract interferes one acre and one hundred and fifteen perches with the Edward Evers survey William Kennedy conveyed to James Hunter who devised the same to James Hunter the present owner
