



A Draught of A tract of land situate on the East Branch of Stone Creek in Barree Township Huntingdon County  
 Containing one hundred and six acres and one hundred and eighteen perches and allowance of six per cent for roads  
 & so Surveyed for Michal Troy on Order No. 1311 dated 22<sup>nd</sup> September 1766

Note the red lines represent the draught of a Tract of Land surveyed for James Laird on order No. 1303, dated the 20th Sept. 1766. This  
 survey interferes one hundred and six acres and one hundred and eighteen perches with the Michal Troy survey. James Laird  
 conveyed to William McElevay who conveyed to Samuel Porter who conveyed to John Cree who conveyed to James Thompson  
 who devised the same to Alexander Thompson the present owner.

The dotted lines are part of a survey made for William McManemy on warrant dated the 20th day of September 1762  
 this tract interferes nine acres and one hundred and six perches with the Michal Troy tract. William McManemy con-  
 veyed to Col. Jno. Armstrong from whom the same was sold by the Sheriff to John Montgomery who appears to  
 have abandoned his claim. Wm. Manemy not paid, returned by Mr Africa, on contract. James Laird Patented
