



Connected Draft of lands, situate in Lower Chanceford township, York county, the one in black lines, of 120³/₄ acs. was patented to John Matson on the 18th day of December 1772, and the other in red lines, said to contain 228 acs. 47 p. & all was originally surveyed in pursuance of an Application No. 5335, dated the 1st of February 1769 to John Matson. And now September 22nd 1854 the parts marked A and B, (being part of the said 228 acs. 47 ps Tract) surveyed for Messrs. Robert W. Coleman and Wm. Coleman, the present owners, for the purpose of Patenting the same. the Part A containing forty acres and one hundred and forty one perches and allowance of six Pr. Ct. and the part marked B containing one hundred and thirteen acres and forty perches and the usual allowance of six Pr. Ct. for Floods &c
