



Situate on the waters of Little Juniatta River in Antis township Huntingdon County containing three hundred and twenty nine acres and three fourths of one acre and allowance of six percent for Roads. Surveyed the 1st day of April 1767 for Jeremiah Williams on Order No. 2622 dated the 29th January 1767. Daniel Africa D.S.

No. 1 represented by dotted lines is part of a survey made for Mary McCarron on Warrant dated the 21st day of September 1795. This survey interferes thirty eight acres and thirty seven perches with the Jeremiah Williams tract. Mary McCarron conveyed to John Gullifer, who conveyed to Joseph Hutchison the present owner. No. 2 represents part of a survey made for John Ate on warrant dated the 1st day of February 1817. This survey interferes thirty seven acres with the Jeremiah Williams tract. John Ate is the present owner. No. 3 represents part of a survey made for Richard Glasco on an Improvement commenced in 1798. This survey interferes ninety four acres and sixty one perches with the Jeremiah Williams tract. Richard Glasco is the present owner. No. 4 represents part of a survey made for George Ward on warrant dated the 28th day of February 1785. This survey interferes one hundred and eight acres and ninety four perches with the Jeremiah Williams survey. George Ward conveyed to George Duffield who devised the same to his heirs, who conveyed to Michael Wallace the present owner. No. 5 represents part of a survey made for John Swarts on Warrant dated the 7th day of January 1797. This survey interferes fifty one acres and fifty one perches with the Jeremiah Williams tract. John Swarts conveyed to James More the present claimant. Note this tract is also claimed by John Glasco on an Improvement made 23 years ago. John Glasco sold to John Coleman the present claimant.
