Jacob Cherry, not pat'd. ✓ No. 1 represents part of a survey made for Thomas Coleman on Warrant dated the 2nd day of March 1767. this survey interferes eighteen acres and fifty five perches with the Edward Murphey tract. Thomas Coleman is the present owner. ✓ No. 2 represents part of a survey made for Abraham Feters on an Improvement made some years ago.

this survey interferes thirty seven acres and forty two perches with the Edward Murphey survey. Abraham Feters is the present owner. ✓ No. 3 represents part of a survey made for James Ferral on warrant dated the 15th day of November 1757.

This survey interferes one hundred and twenty four acres and one hundred and fifty five perches with the Edward Murphey tract.

James Ferral conveyed to Edward Hodges who conveyed to George Feters who conveyed to Daniel McCalla who is the present owner of the interference. ✓ No. 4 represents part of a survey made for Richard Glasco by virtue of an improvement commenced in 1798. This survey interferes sixty two & one half acres with the Edward Murphey tract. Richard Glasco is the present owner. ✓ No. 6 represents a survey made for Jacob Cherry on Warrant dated the 23rd day of February 1815. this survey interferes forty two acres and one hundred and fifty two perches with the Edward Murphey survey. Jacob Cherry is the present owner.

✓ No. 5 represents part of a survey made for Mary McCannon on warrant dated the 21st day of September 1795, this survey interferes twenty nine acres and eight four perches with the Edward Murphey tract. Mary McCannon conveyed to John Gullifer who conveyed to Joseph Hutchison the present owner. No. 7 represents part of a survey made for John Baynton & Samuel Wharton on warrant dated the 28th day of July 1766. This survey interferes thirty nine acres and thirty six perches with the Edward Murphey tract. John Baynton & Samuel Wharton conveyed to Richard Neave Sen'r & Richard Neave Jr. who conveyed to Andrew Cherry the present owner.
