



Situate in Porter Township near the town of Alexandria, Huntingdon County, containing one hundred and forty two acres & allowance of six per cent & so Surveyed the 6th day of June 1768 for Thomas Porter on order No. 957 dated the 26th day of August, 1766.

The dotted lines represent the draught of a tract of land surveyed the 4th day of September 1792, for Thomas Johnston on warrant dated the 25th day of April, 1763. This tract interferes ninety seven acres and fourteen perches with the Thomas Porter survey. Thomas Johnston devised to William Johnston who devised to Thomas Johnston the present owner.

The yellow lines represent part of a survey in name of Alexander Benstead, surveyed for him the 10th June 1766 on warrant dated the 12th August, 1762. This tract interferes thirty seven acres and one hundred and twenty four perches with the Thomas Porter survey. Alexander Benstead conveyed to Peter Benson who conveyed to William Johnston who devised the same to John Johnston the present owner.
