This tract interferes one hundred and fifteen acres with the James Mitchell tract. Richard Malone conveyed to John Lee who also purchased from James Mitchell. John Lee conveyed to Christian Cowell who conveyed to John Rush from whom it was sold by the Sheriff of Bedford County to William Tod who conveyed to Andrew Young who conveyed to John Rush who conveyed to Peter Morgerett who conveyed to George Morgerett the present owner. No. 2 partly represented by the latre coulered lines is a draft of A tract of land surveyed for John Rush on Warrant dated the 25d day of December, 1795. This tract interferes one hundred and fifteen acres with the James Mitchell survey. James Mitchell conveyed to John Lee who conveyed to Christian Cowell who conveyed to John Rush who obtained the aforesaid warrant and from whom the same was sold by the Sheriff of Bedford county to William Tod, who conveyed to Andrew Young who conveyed to John Rush who conveyed to Peter Morgerett who conveyed to George Morgerett the present owner. No. 3 represented by the dotted lines is a draft of A tract of land surveyed for Isaac Cowell on Warrant dated the 11th day of May 1785. This tract interferes twenty nine acres & one hundred & twelve perches with the James Mitchell survey. James Mitchell conveyed to John Lee who conveyed to Christian Cowell who conveyed to Isaac Cowell who obtained the aforesaid warrant and conveyed to George Morgerett the present owner.
