



Situate on the ^{both} ~~South East~~ sides of the Playstown Branch of Juniatta in Hopewell township, Huntingdon County. Containing one hundred and thirty three acres and allowance of six per cent. Surveyed the 9th day of June, 1767. on order to John Lutrens dated the 1st day of August 1766, No. 632.

The dotted lines represent the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Casper Myers on Warrant dated the 2nd day of January 1792. This tract interferes seventy nine acres and twenty nine perches with the John Lutrens survey. Samuel Meredith bought Casper Myers Improvement and took out the said warrant in the name of Casper Myers. he conveyed to Casper Myers who conveyed to John Craffins the present owner.

Note. Allis Allison first improved the interference in 1762, and conveyed to Hugh Guthrie who conveyed to George Myers who devised the same to Casper Myers from whom it degenerated as above

The red lines represent the Draught of A tract of land first improved by Hugh Guthrie in 1770, who conveyed to Frederick Monshour who conveyed to John oblardle who conveyed to Anthony Beaver. who conveyed to Jacob Hess who obtained a Warrant dated the 14th day of June 1828 - and who is the present owner. this survey interferes fifty acres and one hundred and forty perches with the John Lutrens tract.
