To Jacob Spangler Esqr. S. G. No. 1. represents part of a survey made for John Baynton & Samuel Wharton on Warrant dated the 28th day of July 1766. This survey interferes twenty acres and one hundred and thirty perches with the Nicholas Shoffler tract. John Baynton & Samuel Wharton conveyed to Richard Neave Senr and Richard Neave Jr. who conveyed to Robert McTrnight who devised the same to his heirs who conveyed to John C. Smith the present owner. No. 2. represents part of a survey made for John Baynton & Samuel Wharton on warrant dated the 28th day of July 1766. This survey interferes fifty three acres with the Nicholas Shoffler survey. John Baynton & Samuel Wharton conveyed to Richard Neave & Son who conveyed to Robert McTrnight who devised the same to his heirs who conveyed to John C. Smith the present owner. The green lines represent part of a survey made for John Baynton & Samuel Wharton on warrant dated the 28th day of July 1766. This survey interferes two hundred and thirteen acres and eighty two perches with the Nicholas Shoffler survey. John Baynton & Samuel Wharton conveyed to Richard Neave & son who conveyed to Robert McTrnight who devised the same to his heirs who conveyed to John C. Smith the present owner.
