No. 1 represents part of a survey made for John Baynton & Samuel Wharton on Warrant dated the 28th day of July 1766. This survey interferes thirty seven acres and twenty perches with the John Mc Guire tract. John Baynton and Samuel Wharton conveyed to Richard Neave & Son who conveyed to Robt. Mc Knight who devised the same to his heirs who conveyed to John C. Smith the present owner. No. 2 represents part of a survey made for John Glasco on warrant dated the 2nd day of November 1810. This survey interferes one hundred and fifty acres and thirty seven perches with the John Mc Guire tract. John Glasco is the present owner. No. 3 is part of a survey made for Edward Bell on warrant dated 9th August 1810. This survey interferes eighty five acres with the John Mc Guire tract. Edward Bell is the present owner. No. 4 is part of a survey made for Hugh Carson on Warrant dated 7th January 1797. This survey interferes forty nine acres and twenty three perches with the John Mc Guire tract. Hugh Carson conveyed to James & Joseph Hopkins the present owners. No. 2, John Glasco. Patented. No. 3 Edward Bell. Patented.
