



Situate on a Run emptying into Little Juniatta in Antis township Huntingdon County containing two hundred and fifty seven acres and allowance of six per cent. Surveyed the 3rd day of April 1767 for George Melts Jr. on order No. 2618 dated the 29th January 1767.

No. 1 represents part of a survey made for John Baynton & Samuel Wharton on warrant dated the 28th day of July 1766. This tract interferes one thirty seven acres and one hundred and eighteen perches with the George Melts Jr. tract. John Baynton & Samuel Wharton conveyed to Richard Neave Sen. & Richard Neave Jr. who conveyed to Robert McKnight who devised the same to his heirs, who conveyed to Andrew Henderson & Robt. Allison. Andrew Henderson devised to Robert Allison the present owner. No. 2 represents part of a survey made for Baynton & Wharton on warrant dated the 28th day of July 1766. This survey interferes one hundred and nineteen acres and fifty two perches with the George Melts tract. John Baynton and Samuel Wharton conveyed to Richard Neave Sen. & Richard Neave Jr. who conveyed to Robert McKnight, who devised the same to his heirs who conveyed to John C. Smith the present owner.
