In pursuance of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations or other Office titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government and by the authority of the Board of property I have this 25th day of January 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of two hundred and ninety seven acres and one hundred and twelve perches & allowance of six per cent adjoining lands of Henry Huntle, Charles Campbell, Thomas Caughel and others situate on the west side of Blacklick Creek on a run above Letartz Camp about one & a half miles in Blacklick township in the County of Indiana, By Virtue of an Order issued to John Ramsey the 3d April, 1769, No. 906 To Gabriel Heister Esquire, Surveyor General John Taylor D.S.
 N.B. That of the above survey represented by the dotted line and the letters A. B. & C. was surveyed to Thomas Caughel on the 24th Novr. 1769, By Order of the 17th April, 1769, No. 3101. That part embracing the letters D. & E. was surveyed to Charles Campbell on the 22d of January, 1790, by warrant of the 24th August 1786 and that part embracing the letter F. was surveyed to Henry Huntle the 25 October 1769 by Order of the 3d April, 1769.
