



J. Campbell, Pat'd  
T. Coulter. Survey not ret'd.

A Draft of A tract of land situate in Cumberland Valley, on the head waters of Evits Creek in Cumberland Valley township, Bedford County Containing One hundred and thirty acres & eighty five perches & allowance of Six per Cent for Roads, Surveyed in pursuance of Order No. 656 dated the 1st day of August, 1766, granted to James White.

No. 1 represented by the dotted lines is a draft of A tract of land surveyed in pursuance of A warrant granted to James Campbell dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1785. This tract interferes with the James White tract one hundred and twenty one acres and one hundred & twenty perches. James Campbell sold to George Smith who sold to Matthew Mc Ferron who also bought all of the James White tract, which interferes with James Campbell, from the Executors of Saml. Perry. It was sold from Matthew Mc Ferron by the Sheriff of Bedford County to George Smith who sold to Nicholas Boor, who sold to John May Esqr, who devised it to Baltzer Fletcher and John Hershiser the present owners.

No. 2 Represented by the late coloured lines is a draft of a tract of land surveyed in pursuance of a warrant granted to Thomas Coulter dated (supposed 28 Feb'y 1787) This tract interferes with the James White tract four acres and ninety seven perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads & so. Thomas Coulter's heirs conveyed to Joshua Johnston from the same was sold by the Sheriff of Bedford County to John Tod Esqr the present owner.
