



Beginning at a corner marked Black oak standing on y<sup>e</sup> eastern side of a small Run that Runs into Cornestogoe thence east by vacant land 747 perches to another Black oak thence south by vacant land 253 perches to a Spanish oak standing by a small branch of y<sup>e</sup> Mill Creek thence north 83 degrees westerly by vacant land 753 perches to a Black oak thence north by vacant land 156 perches to the place of Beginning containing 900 acres with the allowance of 6<sup>th</sup> Cent survey'd the 22<sup>d</sup> of 8<sup>th</sup> 1718 Pursuant to a warrant from y<sup>e</sup> Com<sup>rs</sup> of Property dated the 4<sup>th</sup> of 8<sup>th</sup> 1718.
