



A Scale of 80 pertch or a quarter of one mile.

September the 21. 1688.

Then surveyed for William Wood - one tract of land containing 250 acres lying on the east west side of Darby Creek beginning at a marked white oak standing near the 5<sup>d</sup> creek being a corner mark of Richard Tuckers land and from thence running  $N. S. W. 160$  pertch by a line of marked trees to a marked post being a corner mark of Ambros Boons land thence running  $N. N. W. 44$  pertch by John Simcocks aforesaid Boons line of marked trees 100 pertch to a marked post and from thence running  $N. S. W. 400$  pertch along the aforesaid Boons line of marked trees to a marked dead oak from thence running  $N. N. W. 44$  pertch by John Simcocks line of marked trees to a marked Sasafraz tree standing by a run and from thence running  $E. N. E. 540$  pertch by Edward Gibbs line of marked trees to a marked red oak standing by Darby Creek and from thence running down the 5<sup>d</sup> creek on severall courses to the first mentioned white oak.
