



Pursuant to two warrants from Edward Pennington then Surveyor General bearing Date the 8th day of ye 9th mo. 1701: directed unto me I hereby certify that I have surveyed and laid out a certaine lot of ground in the City of Philadelphia to John Swift bounded one the east with Delaware- 2^d street and one ye south with Thomas Joanes lot and one ye west with bak lots and one the north with Phillip Howells lot being in length 303 feet and in breadth 34 feet with another pece bounded one ye north with Robert Adair's lot and one ye west with ye 3^d Street and one the south with Thomas Joans lot: and one ye east with ye ends of the 2^d Street lots being in length 190 feet & breadth 20 feet, with another lot in Right of William Birgely bounded on the north with the Reputed Lot of John Burchel and one ye west with bak Lots and one ye south with the Reputed Lot of Benjamin Chambers and one ye east with ye 2^d street from Delaware being in Length 303 feet & in breadth 51 feet and was surveyed all 3 Lots aforesaid ye 14th of ye 3^d mo. 1702 and according to ye bounds above described ~~is~~ is returned into ye General Surveyor's offic- at Philadelphia the 20th day of ye same.
