



Whereas severall persons have requested part of y<sup>e</sup> bank of Philadelphia lying on Delaware River to build thereon, wee having taken into our consideration y<sup>e</sup> Lamentable ruine w<sup>ch</sup> y<sup>e</sup> said bank hath suffered and daily doth, and y<sup>t</sup> y<sup>e</sup> pullick hath not taken care to prevent y<sup>e</sup> same tho often urged thereto, wee have therefore thought fitt whereby to putt a stop as much as possible to preserve the said bank, & to encourage those who are willing and able forthwith to performe y<sup>e</sup> Proprietarys regulations in building ag<sup>t</sup> y<sup>e</sup> said bank, wharfing out to Low water marke and leaving a street between y<sup>e</sup> bank and y<sup>e</sup> wharfe according to y<sup>e</sup> Proprietors grant to Robt Turner & Samuel Carpenter, & Regulation.

These are therefore in y<sup>e</sup> Proprietarys name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed unto Jo<sup>seph</sup> Ap John Thirty feet to y<sup>e</sup> northward of but contiguous to Alex. Guests bank lot. To Charles Pickerin twenty feet to y<sup>e</sup> northward but contiguous to John Ap John. To W<sup>m</sup> Lee ~~thirty~~ <sup>thirty</sup> feet to y<sup>e</sup> northward but contiguous to Charles Pickerin to Dan<sup>iel</sup> Smith Thirty feet to y<sup>e</sup> northward but contiguous to W<sup>m</sup> Lee. To Jo<sup>seph</sup> ~~thirty~~ <sup>Thomas Jenner</sup> twenty five feet to y<sup>e</sup> northward but contiguous to Dan<sup>iel</sup> Smith Phil Howell twenty five feet to y<sup>e</sup> northward but contiguous to ~~thirty~~ <sup>Thom Jenner</sup>. To W<sup>m</sup> Bradford & ~~thirty~~ <sup>Somerey Adams</sup> fifty feet to the northward but contiguous to Phil Howell and make returne to y<sup>e</sup> Secretarys office of each of y<sup>e</sup> fore going surveys. Dated at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 29<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> first month 1689.
