



By virtue of two warrants from the Commissioners of Property the one bearing date ^{for the buying five hundred acres of land to Derick Johnson} the Twenty eighth Day of August 1719 in right of Thomas Parkhurst Citizen and Stationer ^{of London} the other bearing date the 5th day of the 3^d month 1719 for the laying out of Eight hundred acres of land to y^e said Derick Johnson being a purchase made by him of the s^d Commissioners there was laid out to the said Johnson in the County of Philad^a on a branch of Perkiomick Creek a certain tract of land beginning at a black oak corner of Henry Reeds land thence by the same north east one-thirty seven perches to a black oak corner of the said Reeds land thence by the same land south east eighty perches to a white oak Saplin thence by land of Isaac Glynn north east one hundred and eight perches to a white oak thence by land of Christian Miar north west one hundred thirty one perches to a post thence by land of the s^d Christian Miar north east two hundred thirty three perches to a post thence by land of Henry Funk north west ninety five perches to a white oak thence by the same land sixty two perches to a post being a corner of Hans Nise's land thence by same and vac^d land ^{north west} two hundred sixty six perches to a post thence by vac^d land south west two hundred and fifteen perches ~~perches~~ to a black oak thence by land of John Hurstied south east eighty four perches to a post thence by y^e s^d Hurstied and vac^d land south west three hundred twenty five perches to a post thence ^{south} east by Garret Clements land three hundred ^{of thirty} ~~eight~~ eight perches to the place of Beginning containing one thousand ~~eighty three~~ ^{fifty two} acres (with y^e usual Allowance) in part of the above thirteen hundred acres Surveyed June y^e 24th 1729
