



Gulielma Maria Fell's land Situate on Tulpehocken Creek in the County of Lancaster, Begins at a Black oak being a corner of John Page's land thence South by the same 370 Poles to a white oak, Thence by the sd Page's land East by South 256 Poles to a Hickery, East 470 Poles to a white oak, Thence by Vacant land North 65° East 320 Poles to a Hickery East by North 214 Poles to a white oak, North 70° East 240 Poles to a Small white oak, East by South 480 Poles to a white oak, South 55° East 235 Poles to a post, thence by the sd John Page's land North 16° East 1058 Poles to a post, Thence South 80° West along the Barron 2224 Poles to a Hickery, thence South West 321 Poles to the place of Beginning Containing Ten Thousand Acres.
