



Pursant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> dated the 13 day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1709/1 to resurvey unto Samuel Baker his land in the Savanna in the Manour of Highland in the County of Bucks with said land Lyes in two Parcels & the upper most on the River Begins at a hickery being a corner Richard Houghts land standing by the River Delaware Thence by the said Houghts land west twenty three deg<sup>s</sup> south sixty nine perches to a post Then north west by north by the said Manour land thirty perches to a post Then by Matthias Harvies Childrens land north east sixty three perches to a Linden tree standing by the said River Delaware Then down the River by the course thereof south forty deg<sup>s</sup> east fifty three perches to the place of Begining Containeing sixteen acres and eighty perches.

And the other peice or Lott of the savanna Begins at an Elme tree by the said River Delaware Then by the said manour land west twenty six perches and a half to a white oake Then by the same land north west sixty (obliterated) a half to a post Then by Richard Houghts land east thirty four deg<sup>s</sup> north forty five perches to a hickery standing by the side of the said River Then down the river by the courses thereof south thirty five deg<sup>s</sup> east forty one perches Then south eighteen deg<sup>s</sup> east thirty eight perches to the place of begining Containeing sixteen acres and forty perches both peices or Lotts Containeing Thirty Two acres and three fourths of an acre Surveyed and certified the 4<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>rd</sup> mo 1701.
