Whereas by virtue of a warrant bearing date ye 20th day of October 1712 under the hands of Samuel Carpenter Isaac Norris and James Logan To resurvey unto Richard Hill a Certain Tract of land in the County of Bucks formerly laid out to James Hill of Beckingham in the County of Somerset in Great Britain first purchaser of five hundred acres of Land to be laid out in this Province whose Son & Heir Rich^d Hill of Bristol sold all the s^d five hundred acres (with) ye Appurtenances to ye aforesaid Richard Hill ~~which~~ ^{the} said Tract of land being resurvey'd accordingly appears to be 395 acres w^{ch} with 8 acres of Liberty Land alsoe granted by the s^d warr^t makes 403 ^{acres} 50e that there remains ninety seven acres to be laid out according to ye s^d warr^t to compleat the s^d first purchase And whereas by ~~the~~ ^{they ye said Commissioners ordered} one other warr^t bearing date ye 30th day of ye 10th moth 1712 under the hands of Samuel Carpenter Richard Hill & James Logan, to lay out to Isaac Norris the quantity of 115 acres the Remainder of Richard Collins's Purchase of 1250 Acres: which nevertheless was not Executed now at the Request of James Dickenson that we would grant him to take up the said 97 acres belonging to Richard Hill's Purchase and the 115 acres remaining due to Isaac Norris and alsoe that he may add to the same ^{three hundred eighty & eight} ~~97~~ acres more to make the whole 600 acres from which s^d ~~97~~ ^{three hundred eighty & eight} acres he agrees to pay to ye Prop^{rs} use ^{Thirty} eight pounds sixteen shillings & the usual yearly Quitrent of one shilling Sterling for every Hundred acres. These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the s^d James Dickenson the s^d quantity of 600 acres and make a returne thereof into the Secretary's Office. Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 15th day of ye 8th month Anno Dni 1714.
