



By virtue of warrant from the Proprietaries concerning the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the first month 1701 to execute all warrants directed to Phineas Pemberton and not executed, and pursuant to a warrant from the said Comm<sup>rs</sup> to the said Phineas Pemberton bearing date the 18<sup>th</sup> / 17<sup>th</sup> 1701 to resurvey unto Rebeckah Shippen 1200 acres of land in Wrights town and Makefield in the County of Bucks belonging to the estate of her former Husband Francis Richardson; Resurveyed unto the said Rebeckah Shippen the said tract of land Beginning at a Black oak at the side of Wrights town Park, being also John Chapman's corner, Thence by the said Park N.E. 116 perches to a black oak, Then by Joseph Amblers land N.E. by E 330 perches to a black oak, Then by the out bounds of Wrights town S.E. 220 per. to a black oak at the corner thereof, Then N.E. by vacant 302 per. to a post by a small Run of water between a black oak and a white oak both marked for a corner, Then S.E. by John Baldwin's land 405 per. to a black oak, Then by Joseph Millner's land S.W. 252 per. to a Hickory at the head of a Spring, Then N. 21 deg. N by vacant to a black oak, Then by Joseph Millner's land S.W. 28 per. to a black oak at another corner of the said Chapman's land, Then by the said land west 444 perches to the place of Beginning containing 1377 2/3 acres; Resurveyed the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1702.
