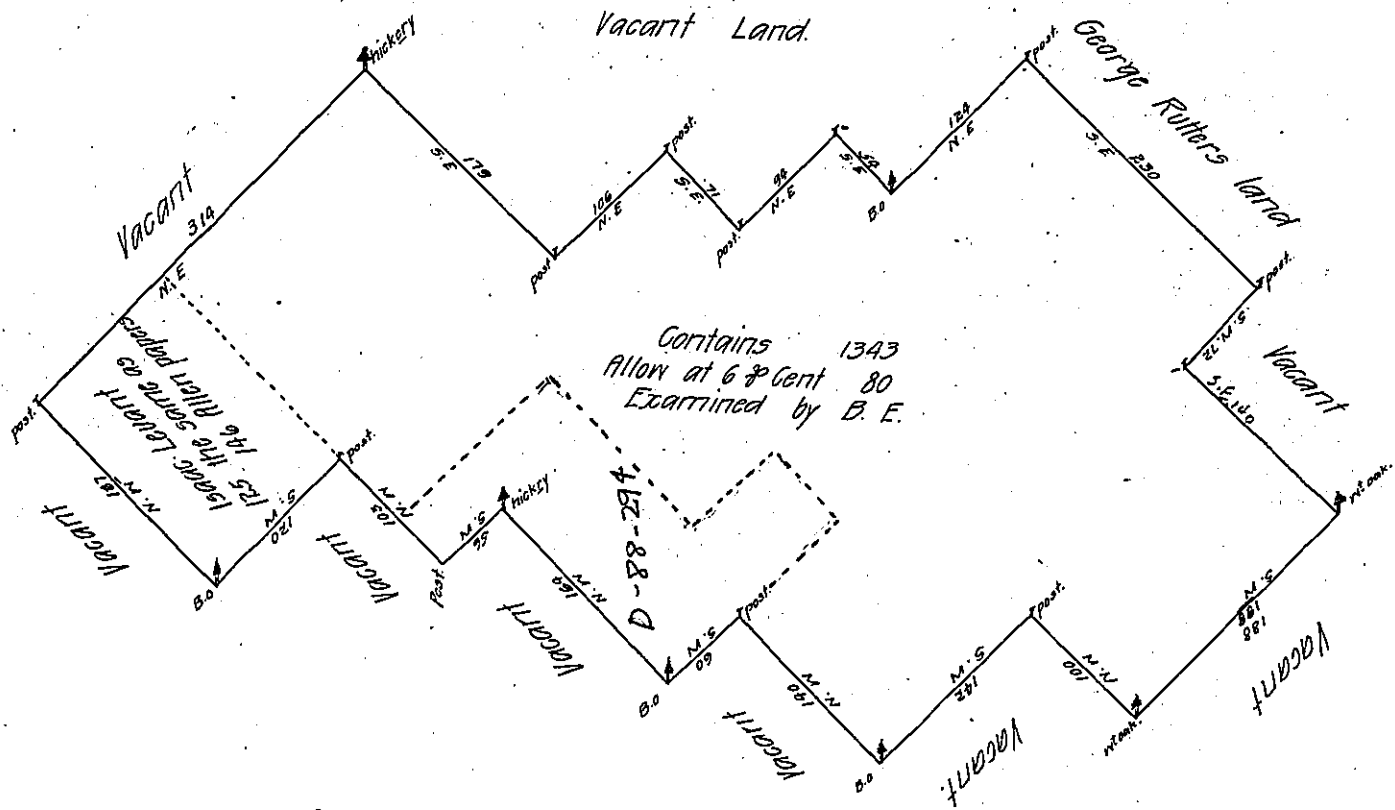

I am informed by Nicholas Scull that the land here noted as vacant was at the time of this survey Seized by Palatines whose improvements he then spared.

By virtue of a warrant from \_\_\_\_\_ dated the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 1730. Surveyed and laid out to William Allen a tract of land situate in Oley in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a Post in George Rutter's line thence by vacant land south west seventy two perches to a post thence by vacant land south east one hundred and forty perches to a white oak corner tree thence by vacant land south west one hundred eighty eight perches to a white oak corner tree thence by vacant land north west one hundred perches to a post thence by vacant land south west one hundred forty two perches to a black oak markt for a corner thence north west by vacant land one hundred and forty perches to a post thence by vacant land south west sixty perches to a black oak thence by vacant land north west one hundred sixty four perches to a hickory thence south west fifty six perches to a post thence north west one hundred and three perches to a post thence south west one hundred and twenty perches to a black oak saplin thence north west one <sup>hundred</sup> sixty seven perches to a post thence north east three hundred and fourteen perches to a ~~post~~ <sup>hickory</sup> thence south east one hundred seventy nine perches to a post thence north east one hundred and six perches to a post thence south east seventy one perches to a post thence north east ninety four perches to a post thence south east fifty four perches to a black oak thence north east one ~~hundred~~ twenty four perches to a post thence by vacant land and land of George Rutter south east two hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning containing One Thousand three hundred and sixty acres with allowance of six 1/2 Cent. Surveyed 8<sup>th</sup> 15<sup>th</sup> 1730.
