



Surveyd and laid out the 15th day of October Anno 1730 unto William Allen of Philadelphia Esq^r a tract of land Situate ^{in clay} in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a post in George Ritters line, Thence by vacant south west seventy two perches to a post. Then south east one hundred and forty perches to a white oak marked. Thence south west one hundred eighty eight perches to another white oak. Thence north west one hundred perches to a post. Thence south west one hundred forty two perches to a black oak marked. Then north west one hundred and forty perches to a post. Then south west sixty perches to a black oak. Then north west one hundred sixty four perches to a post. Then south west one hundred twenty perches to black oak sappling. Then north west one hundred sixty seven perches to a post. Then north east three hundred and fourteen perches to a hickery. Then south east one hundred seventy nine perches to a post. Then north east one hundred and six perches to a post. Then south east seventy one perches to a post. Then north east ninety four perches to a post. Then south east fifty four perches to a black oak. Then north east one hundred twenty four perches to a post. Then south east by vacant land and the land of George Ritter aforesaid two hundred and thirty perches to the Place Beginning Containing one thousand three hundred and forty three acres with allowance of six & Cent.
