



Whereas Richard Hill, Isaac Norris and James Logan Commissioners of Property by their warrant dated the 19th day of October Anno 1720 Granted at the request of Thomas Griffiths of Philadelphia did authorize and require me to resurvey a certain Tract of land in the County of Philadelphia first laid out to Charles Marshall for one thousand ^{acres} and in case of any deficiency to make good the quantity. This may certify that to complete the whole quantity of one thousand acres with allowance there was surveyed and laid out on the 7th day of June 1727 a tract of Land in the Township of Lyrtrick in the said County of Philadel^a. Beginning at a black oak a corner of William Woodley's land Thence by the same north east one hundred ~~fifty~~ ¹²⁵ perches to a post Then by vacant land north west one hundred and sixty perches to a post Then south west by the land of Richard Haines ~~one hundred fifty~~ ¹²⁵ perches to a post Then by the land of George Boon south east one hundred and sixty perches to the place of Beginning containing One hundred and ~~fifty~~ ¹²⁵ acres.
