W. 80 perch to a marked red oak from thence N. N. W. by a line of marked trees 280 perch to a black oak from thence S. S. W. 65 perch to a marked red oak then S. W. 14.5 perch to a marked white oak and from thence E. S. E. by a line of marked trees 320 perch to the Scool creek side and along the creek on severall courses to the first marked oak containing 400 acres

Also a small Island near adjacent, containing two acres.

Resurveyed for John Boule one piece of marsh or meadow lying on the west side of Scool creek back in the woods being at the head of mill creek and beginning at a marked white oak standing near a run then ~~N. 40 degrees~~ 24 perch to a marked dead oak, then N. 40 degrees E 20 perch to a marked white oak then N 50 degrees W 18 (pbl) to a marked dead oak from thence N W by N 34 perch to a marked white oak then S 65 W 18 perch to a marked white oak then S 15° E 50 perch to the first mentioned (pbl) white oak containing 10 acres.
