



The above is a draught of the Common Lot (a Tract of Land originally so called) situate in East Nottingham Township, Chester County & the Piece of 40 acres therein described was ^{formerly} laid out for the use of the Meeting of the People called Quakers, held there, Beginning at a corner stone, standing at about 87 perches distant on a South Course from the Street Line & 53 perches distant from the North east corner of the Brick Meeting House (so called) on a Course North East by North, & thence by the Land of John Day South 4° East 80 perches to another stone, thence by land of Elisha Hughes, North 89° West 82 perches to a post, thence by land of John White North 2° West 80 perches to a Post, thence by land in possession of the said White & the aforesaid John Day respectively, South 89° East 80 perches to the Place of Beginning
