

Pennsylvania 5.5.

In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the thirteenth day of October, 1760, requiring Nicholas Scull, then Surveyor General to survey for the use of the Honorable Proprietaries the several unappropriated Islands in the Rivers Delaware, Schuylkill & Susquehanna, and the several other Rivers & Creeks in the said Province, and to make return thereof from time to time into the Secretaries Office for their use. I do hereby certify that there was surveyed by Colonel John Armstrong in the Month of November, 1760, the following Islands situate in the River Susquehanna aforesaid, vizt. No. 1, lying about a mile below Peters Mountain Narrows, near the West side of the River, called Allen's Island & containing fifty eight acres & a half with allowance of Six P. Ct. - No. 2, lying above the mouth of Juniata River containing five acres & a half with allowance as aforesaid. No. 3, lying at the mouth of Juniata, near the West side of the River, called Bastins Island & containing six hundred and seventy seven acres with the usual allowance. - No. 4, lying about a mile below Fort Halifax and within a gun shot of the Peach Island, containing thirty eight acres and allowance. - No. 5, lying about a half mile below Halifax, called Peach Island & containing one hundred & ten acres & allowance. - No. 6, lying a little above No. 5, in sight of it, called Armstrong's Island, containing twenty five acres & allowance. - No. 7, lying below Berry's Falls in sight of them & very near the West side of the River, containing twenty one acres & a half of an acre with allowance. - No. 8, lying near the Mouth of Mahatango, near the West Side of the River, called Welch's Island & containing ninety one acres & allowance. - No. 9, lying below the Mouth of Mahatango in sight of No. 8, containing forty one acres & allowance. - No. 10, lying opposite McTrees, called McTrees big Island containing sixobl. obl. acres & allowance. - No. 11, lying opposite McTrees, a little way above No. 10, called Logans Island, containing twenty five acres and a half with allowance. - No. 12, lying a mile above McTrees, called McTrees Cow Island, containing fifteen acres & a half with allowance. - No. 13, lying below the mouth of Mahanoy Creek, on the East Side, called Weisers Island, containing two hundred and twenty four acres & a half with allowance. - No. 14, lying opposite the Mouth of Mahanoy Creek and the end of the Mahanoy Mountain, called Logan's Island, containing two hundred & thirty four acres & a half with allowance. - No. 15, situate in the Junction of the Rivers Juniata & Susquehanna, containing four hundred fifty five acres & three quarters of an acre with allowance, and I do hereby also certify that there was surveyed by Bartrem Galbreath, Deputy Surveyor the several Islands following situate in the River Susquehanna aforesaid, vizt. No. 1, lying on the East Side of the said River opposite to the lands of John Corson & Rudy Heer, containing eight acres & allowance. No. 2, lying in said River, called Mulligan's Island, containing one hundred & eight acres & a quarter with allowance. - No. 3, lying opposite to the lands of John Chambers & Thomas Mctree, containing eleven acres & allowance. - No. 4, lying opposite to Harris's Ferry, called Turkey Island, containing thirty one acres & a half with allowance. - No. 5, called Chesney's Island, containing nine acres & three quarters with allowance, three other Islands lying in the said River were also surveyed by the said Bartrem Galbreath in July, 1762, for the use of the said Honorable Proprietaries, vizt. one
