



In pursuance of a Contract with the Members of the Board of Property of the State of Penna dated Nov. 1st, 1827 and the authority therein specified, the above two tracts of land was survey'd & calculated by virtue of App^r No. 26 calling for five hundred acres of land granted to George Croghan Ap^r 1st, 1769 by the Proprietary Government, each tract now containing two hundred & fifty two acres fifty four perches & allowance situate chiefly in Wilkins Township & the ballance in Varsales Township in the County of Allegheny
