Whereas by virtue of two Warrants from the late Propriet^r dated ye 12th of 8th and ye 8th of 9th in the year 1683, there was surveyd & laid out on ye 15th of the said 9th unto Charles Marshall & Company the Lots of Ground in the City of Philadelphia appurtenant to their purchase of six Thousand acres of land which said Lots having never been improved and their bounds so uncertain that they are not now to be distinguished from vacant Ground and the Right thereof being now vested in Isaac Norris he requests that the said Lots may be laid out a new and whereas there yet remains untaken up six & thirty acres of Liberty Land belonging to the said purchase which also appertains to the said Isaac Norris, He requests the same may be laid out also. These are therefore to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out or cause to be surveyd and laid out unto the said Isaac Norris the City Lots proportionable to the said Purchase where they may be found unsurveyd and the said six and thirty acres of Liberty Land where the same may be found vacant and make returns of the whole into the Secretarys Office Given under our hand and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16th day of the 11th month Anno Dni 1726.
