A certain Tract or Parcel of land Situate in a Fork of Brandiwine Creek in the County of Chester Beginning a Hickery tree marked by the Northern Branch of the said creek at a corner of William Vestels land and extending by ^{the} said Vestels land north twenty four degrees westerly one hundred thirty four perches to another corner Hickery Thence south west by west by William Baldwin's land seventy perches to a third corner Hickery Thence by the said William Baldwin's ^{land} south sixty six Degrees westerly one hundred forty two perches to a corner post Then south twenty seven degrees westerly by Will^m Marshals land thirty six perches to the western Branch of the said Brandiwine Creek Then down the same on the courses thereof two hundred and fifty perches to the Mouth of this and the western Branch Then up the said Western Branch One hundred perches to the first mentioned Hickery tree. Containing two hundred acres.
