

In pursuance of a warrant from Richard Hill, James Logan, and Thomas Griffitts Commission^E of Property dated the 3^d day of October 1728 Requiring me to survey unto Isaac Norris the liberty land appurtenant to Alexander Parker's purchase of one thousand acres This may certifie that on the 23 day of October 1728 I did survey for the said Isaac Norris a piece of Liberties of the City Philadelphia Beginning a great white oak at a corner of Joseph Jones land Thence by the same and the land of Richard Waln south south east one hundred and thirt-een perches to a post Then west south west by the said Waln's land nineteen perches to a post Then by the ^{said} Richard Waln's land north north west one hundred and thirteen perches to a post Then by the said Joseph Jones land east north east nineteen perches to the place of Beginning containing thirteen acres.
