The above figure is a Plot of the Mann<sup>r</sup> of Perkasie which I have Divided by Continuing the lines according to your Direction. Our measure Differs something from Yours which put me on Carrying the Chain myself across some of the lots. I believe you may Depend on the Exactness of the Measure and I think the Water is pretty truly laid down the beginning of the most Solid part of the Mann<sup>r</sup>. I mean the Rocks is Exactly taken where the lines Cross them. I have Venturd to give my Judgment of the lands in each Lot. I have done but Little in Buck-as yet.
