



The dotted lines in the above diagram embracing the letters A. B. C. D. & E. represent the survey of Susanna Knox a return whereof is herewith enclosed. It will be seen that the survey of Susanna Knox has been made upon the spot called for, as near as can be the surveys of Samuel and Joseph Dickson being so situated as to cause the survey of Knox to lie nearly on the North West of both surveys, the land however has been long since appropriated and taken upon other titles the dates whereof are inserted in each draft in the above diagram respectively.

The tract in the name of John Dickson is owned and occupied by Joseph Dickson whose improvement is principally included within the survey now made for Susanna Knox.

The tract in the name of Christopher Rappine is owned and occupied by the heirs of Patrick Mc Gee whose improvement is also within the survey of Knox and is patented as I am informed.

The tract in the name of Henry Smith is occupied by a Widow Moorhead owner not known by me.
