In pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly dated 7th January, 1737 relating to Unpatented Lands under Proprietary Rights &c. And by virtue of a Warrant granted to Richard Ochain for 300 acres "on the Falling Spring on both sides of the Road, adjoining William Dunlop to the east and one Lindsay to the West."

The above described tract appears to have been surveyed 17 April 1772 and is held by virtue of an Order of survey to Wm. Lindsay for 300 acres on the Falling dated 2d April 1767 No. 3304 and said to be patented. Note No evidence of possession in Ochain or of any person claiming under him; although the above appears evidently the location of his warrant.
