



In pursuance of the authority of the Board of property and of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations or other office titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government and for other purposes I have this 23d day of January, 1828 surveyed the above described tract of land containing Two hundred acres and allowance of six percent adjoining lands of Samuel Dictson and Joseph Dictson, John Dictson, William Pimm and others on the North Side of Blacklick Creek situate in Blacklick township in the County of Indiana by virtue of a location granted to Susanna Knox on the 3d day of April 1769, No. 2769

That part of the above survey represented by the dotted line and the letters A & B was surveyed to John Dictson on the 7th of Nov. 1769 by Order of the 17th April 1769 No. 3096 That part embracing the letters C & D was surveyed to Christopher Raphine on the 8th of March, 1787 By warrant of the 16th December 1785 And that part embracing the letter E was surveyed to Henry Smith on the 28th day of February 1787 By Warr. of the 17th Dec. 1785
