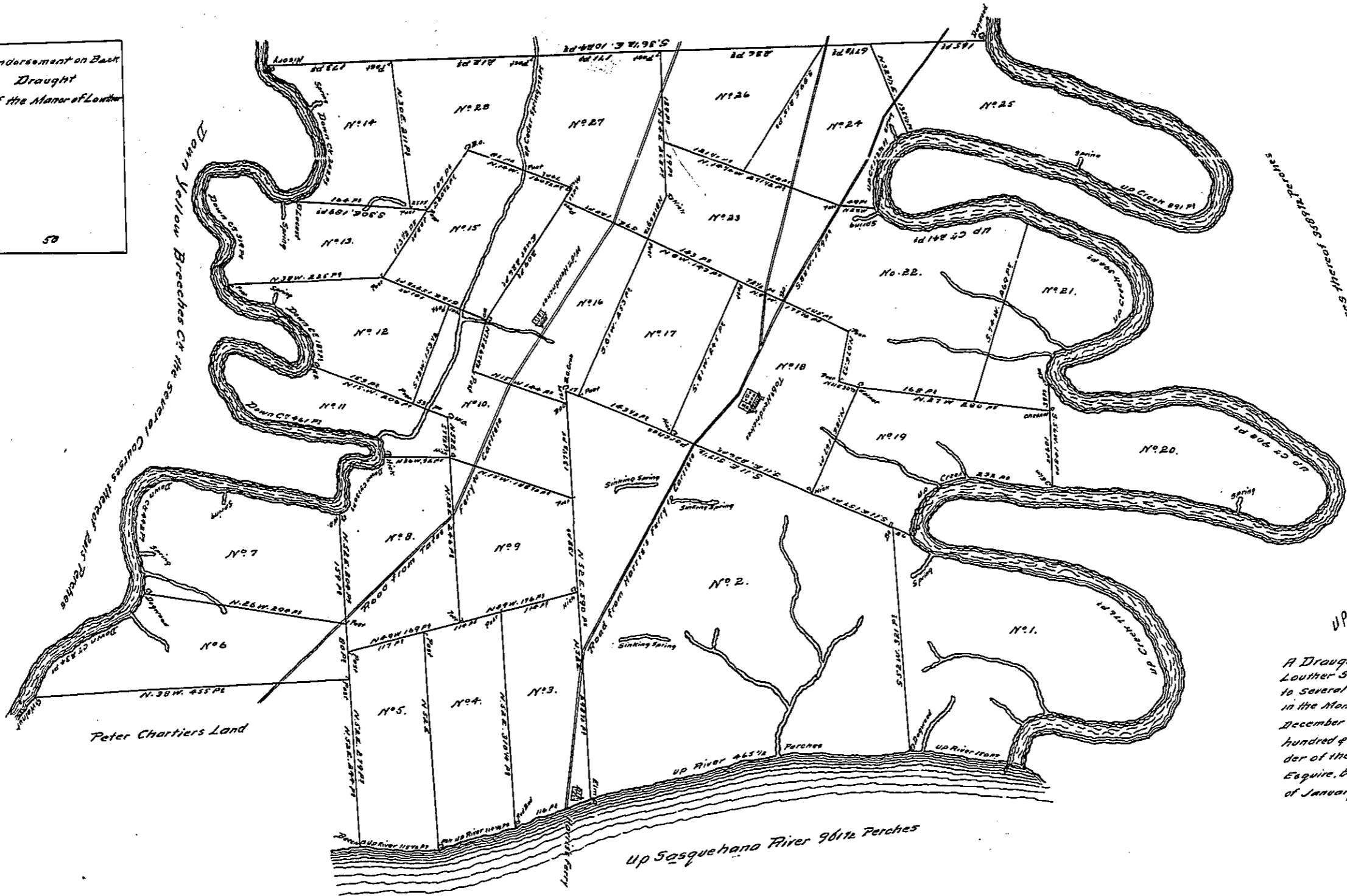

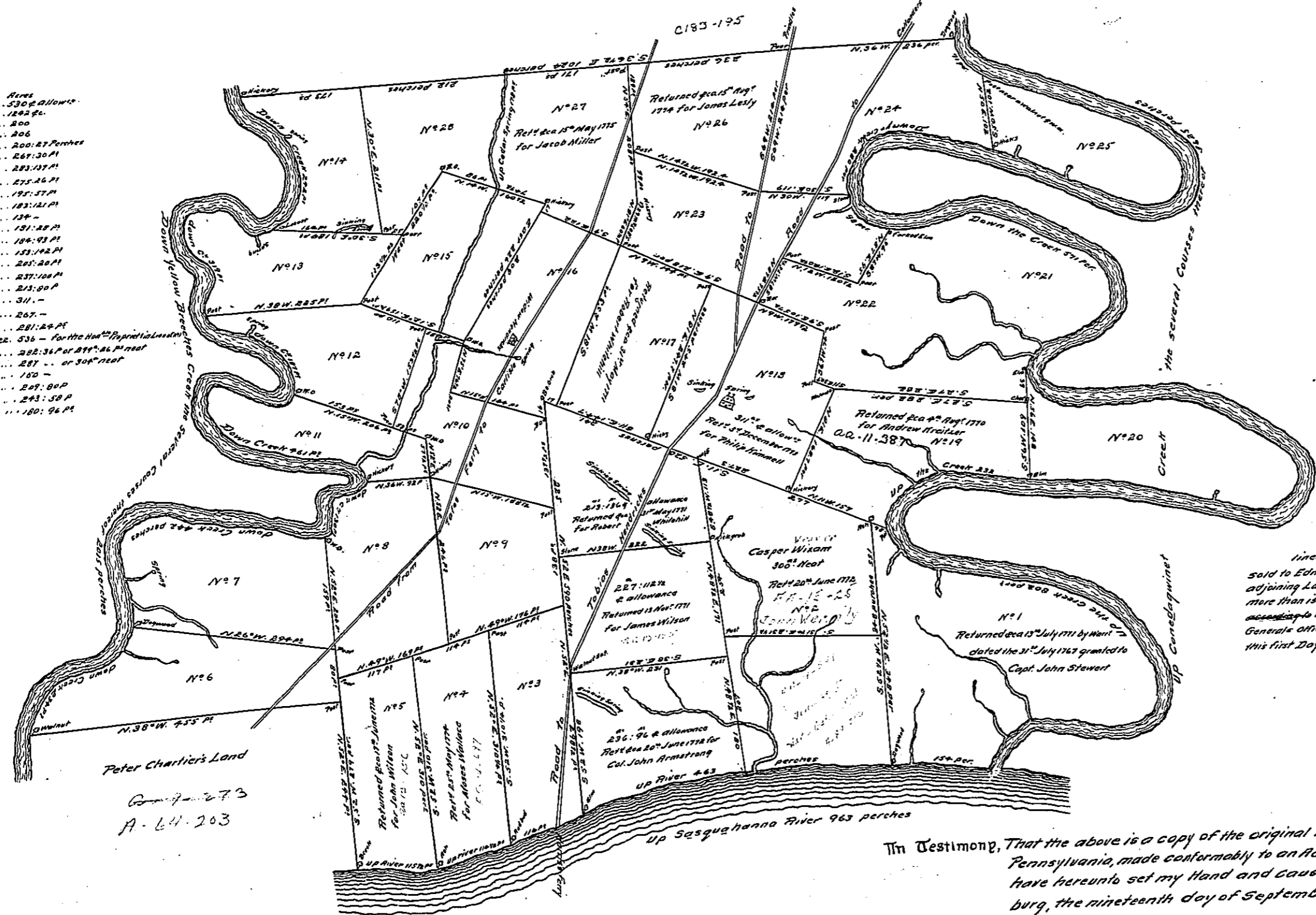

In pursuance of His Honor the Governors Order bearing date the 13th day of May 1767 I went to the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries Manor of Louber in the County of Cumberland (and after receiving notice from Col. John Armstrong that the Court of the said Manor was convened in 1st order) I did on the several days between the 22^d May & 12th June following proceed to survey a certain several of the Divisions of the said Manor represented in Col. Armstrongs Draught to wit Nos. 1, 2, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, and find them as represented in the above Draught to contain in the whole Seventy Eight acres more than they are said to contain in s^d Armstrongs Draught. And as there has been some alterations made in the lines of the following Numbers to wit (21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28) in order to accommodate a Tract sold to Edmund Physick & one other sold to the Rev^d William Thomson, so as least to inclose the adjoining Land I find within the out lines of the several Tracts the Quantity of Nineteen Acres & a half more than is mentioned in s^d Armstrongs Old Draught. And as to the other Numbers they are laid Down according to the lines described in said Draught. And I do now Judge this present Draught in the Surveyors Office as by said order I was directed a Copy of which is returned into the Secretaries Office this first Day of July A.D. 1767.
