

PLAN

of a survey of an Island in the River Delaware in Kingsessing Township Phila County at the mouth of the River Schuylkill surveyed pursuant of a warrant dated March 19th 1851 by Isaac Shallcross deputy sur of the County of Phila

The plan included by the red lines designate the probable location of an island surveyed by John W. Day dep sur pursuant of a warrant dated July 20th 1822.

To the Hon. John Laporte Surveyor General of the State of Pennsylvania
 Pursuant to a warrant ^{dated the 19th day of March 1851} directed authorizing and requiring me to survey unto John W. Ashmead an Island situate in the river Delaware (sometimes called Cabin Island) in the Township of Kingsessing Philadelphia County ly at the mouth of the River Schuylkill within about one quarter of a mile Southeast from State Island save and except that part of said Island which is included within certain specified courses and distances and embraced in a Patent made by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to Thomas R. Wallace the 14th of August 1822. I proceeded to survey the same and find it to be as follows a plan of which is hereunto annexed. Beginning at a corner on the Southeastly side of the Northwestern Channel of the River Delaware which corner bears South Twenty five Degrees fourteen minutes West from the Southernly Corner of a large brick building standing on the ground of the old Lazareths and at the distance of Two thousand two hundred and sixty four feet therefrom Thence by low water mark of the said River Delaware Northeastward about two hundred and eighty eight perches to low water mark at the mouth of the River Schuylkill Thence along by low water mark of the River Delaware Southeastward and southwestward the several courses thereof about Two hundred and thirteen perches to a corner. Thence South eighty eight Degrees forty five minutes West One hundred and forty three perches to the place of beginning Containing (except that part of said Island which is included within certain specified courses and embraced in a patent made by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to Thomas R. Wallace the fourteenth of March 1822) ninety eight acres and eleven perches.
