Part of Windmill Island in the
River Delaware in the County of
Philadelphia opposite the City of
Philadelphia Containing Three
Acres and seventy perches
Surveyed Oct 6 1853 by virtue
of a warrant from the land office
dated Sep 22 1853 by
Isaac Shallcross D.S.

To J. Porter Brawley Esquire Surveyor General of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
Pursuant to a warrant under the seal of the Surveyor Generals office of Pennsylvania to me Directed dated the twenty eighth day of September AD 1853 to me
directed authorising and requiring me to survey to Thomas G. Smith and Robert W. Smith an Island situate in the Delaware river in the County of Philadelphia and opposite the City of Philadelphie Commonly called Windmill Island. Bounded on the N by a certain survey made for Jos Fox and Moses Preston of ten acres and ninety perches of flat at the N end of said Island patented to them Dec 30th 1851 go and bounded on the S by a certain survey made for G.N. Tatham patented to him April 29 1853 & and bounded on the E and W by low water mark of the river Delaware Containing about three acres. I proceeded on the sixth day of October 1853 to survey the same and find it to be as follows. Beginning at low water mark of the River Delaware on the Northwest side of said Island and at the distance of about one hundred and thirty feet nine inches Southward from the line of the fronts of the buildings on the south side of Chestnut street in the City of Philadelphia extended Southeastward across the said River. Thence by a line parallel with the line of the front of the buildings on the south side of Chestnut street as aforesaid and by part of said Island patented to Joseph Fox and Moses Preston as aforesaid South seventy two Degrees forty eight minutes East forty three perches and four tenths of a perch to low water mark of the said River Delaware on the south east side of said Island. Thence down the said river Delaware by low water mark the several courses thereof the General course being South seven Degrees East Thirteen perches and twenty two hundredths of a perch to a corner. Thence by a line parallel with the fronts of the buildings on the south side of Chestnut street as aforesaid and at the distance of two hundred feet southward from the North line of this survey North seventy two Degrees forty eight minutes West forty seven perches and ninety one hundredths of a perch to low water mark of the said River Delaware on the Northwest side of said Island. Bounded by part of said Island patented to George N. Tatham. Thence by low water mark of the said River Delaware the several courses thereof the General course being North Twelve Degrees and twenty six minutes East Twelve perches and one tenth of a perch to the place of beginning containing Three acres and Seventy perches NB The Northerly line of this survey if extended Northwestward across the River Delaware will strike the south side of the South Wall of the brick silo marked for the directory of the City of Philadelphia 1022 of South Wharves. A plan of the above survey is hereto annexed Nov 21 1853.
