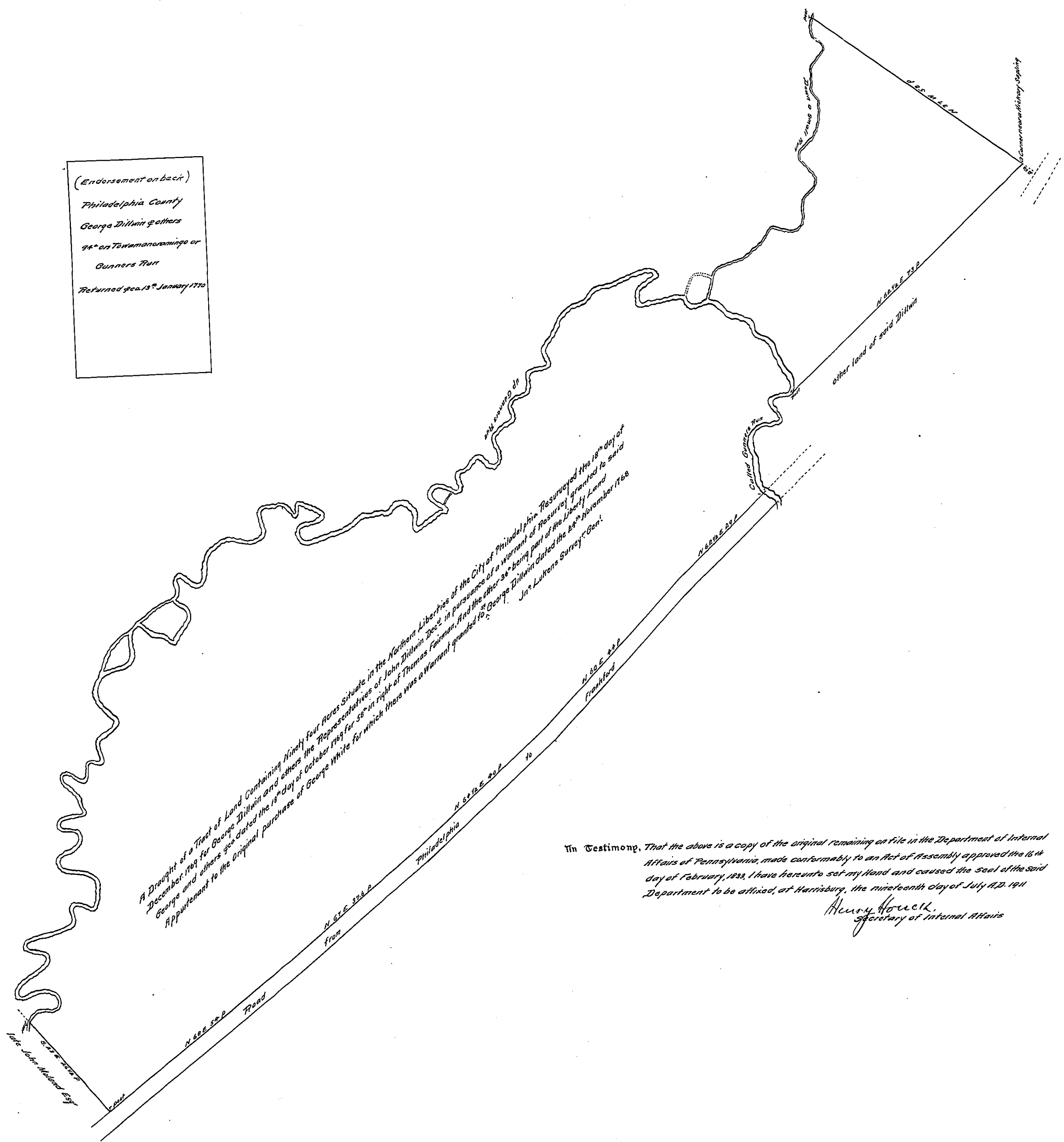

A Draught of a Tract of Land Containing Ninety four Acres Situate in the Northern Liberties of the City of Philadelphia Resurveyed the 18<sup>th</sup> day of December 1769 for George Dillwin and others the Representatives of John Dillwin Dec<sup>d</sup> in pursuance of a warrant of Resurvey granted to said George and others Dec<sup>d</sup> the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1769 for 38<sup>th</sup> in right of Thomas Fairman, And the other 38<sup>th</sup> being part of the Liberty Land Appurtenant to the Original purchase of George White for which there was a warrant granted to George Dillwin dated the 28<sup>th</sup> November 1768 J<sup>n</sup> Lukens Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>.

In Testimony, That the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1832, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the said Department to be affixed, at Harrisburg, the nineteenth day of July A.D. 1911
