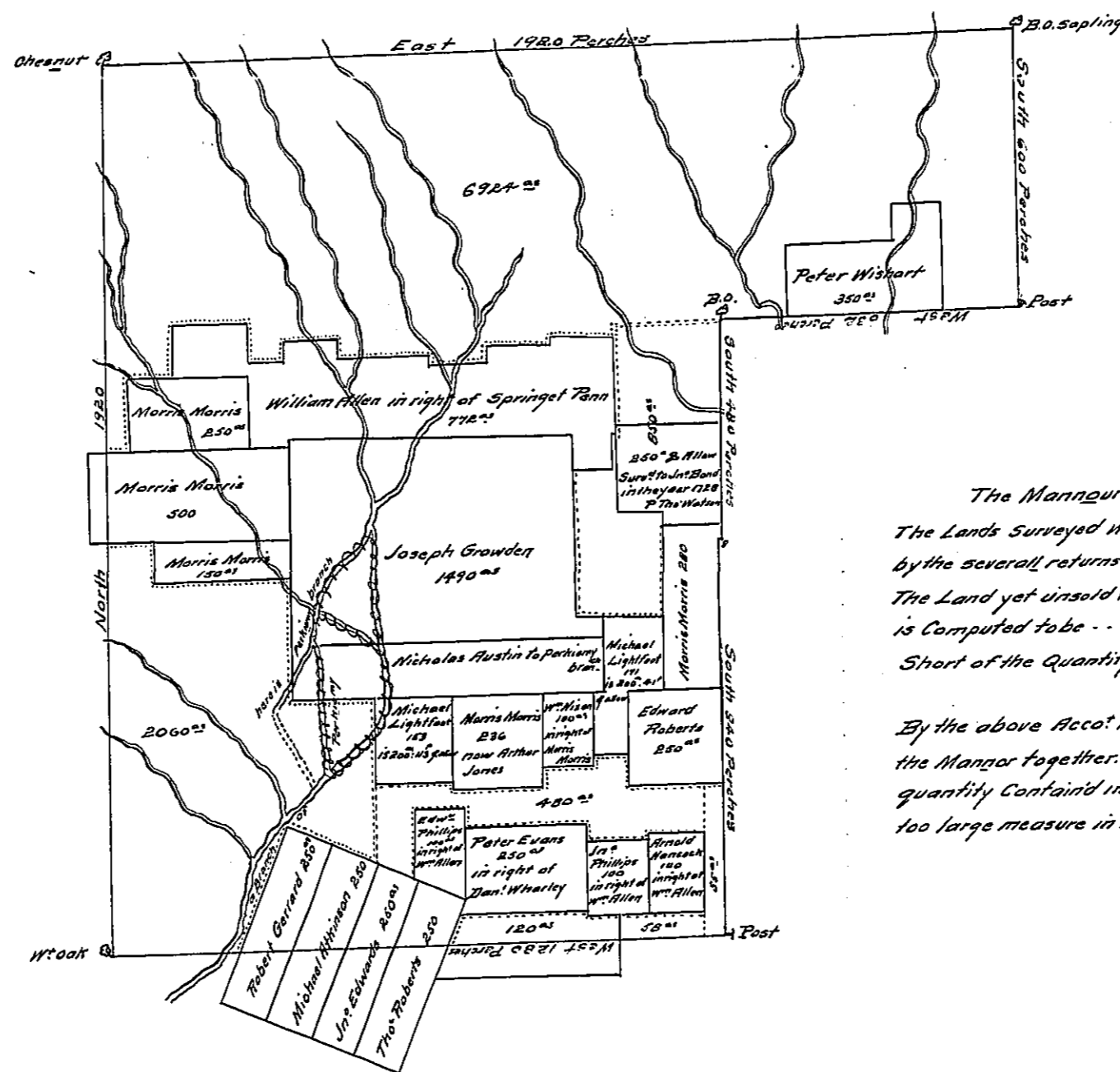

By the above Accot it appears that taking the severall tracts Surveyed within the Mangor together, the quantity added to the Vacancies will not make the quantity Contained in ye Mangor by 436^{ac} which defect tis Presum'd arises from too large measure in those surveys.

Pursuant to a Warrant from the Honourable the Proprietaries dated the 5th day of March 1734 for the more Certain finding out and fixing the lines and bounds of their Mangour Beginning at a post being a corner of a Tract of land laid out to Griffith Jones daced thence West 1280 perches to a White Oak thence North 1920 perches to a Chesnut thence East 1920 perches to a Small Black Oak Sapling thence South 600 perches to a post in a line of James Logan's land thence by that land of Joseph Gilbert West 632 perches to a Black Oak thence by land of the said Joseph Gilbert South 400 perches thence West 8 perches thence South by the said Jones's tract 840 perches to the Beginning Containing 16749 acres with the allowance of Six Per Cent.

Note that all the surveys within the above Mangour were made by John Cutler & John Chapman Late Surveyors of the County of Bucks
 N.B. the Vacancies in the Mangor are Described by Prickt Lines.
