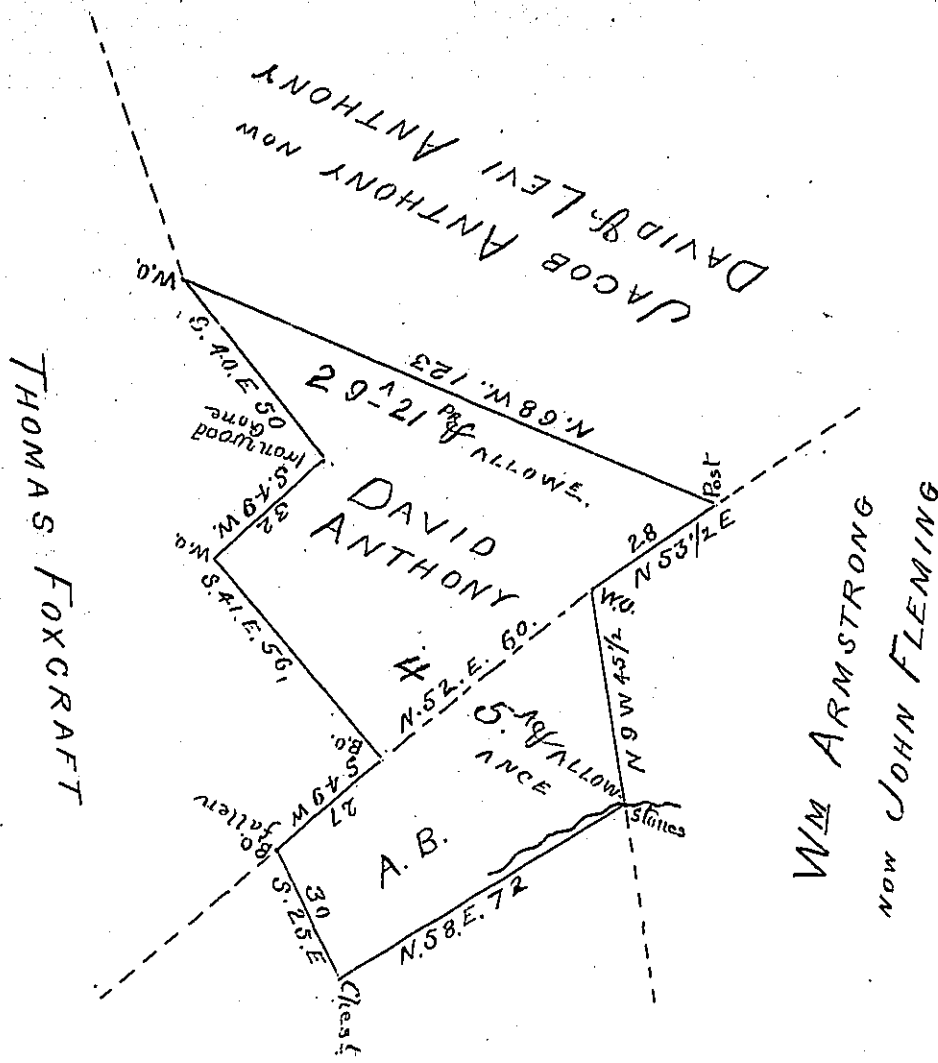

B. was surveyed to William Johnston on the 13<sup>th</sup> of January last by warrant of 30<sup>th</sup> of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1835 but it will appear by the Articles of agreement which he herewith transmitted to you that Johnston relinquishes his claim to it therefore I have calculated & enclosed it in with Anthony's survey Johnston was in company at the close of this survey & appeared very anxious to have the matter settled that he might obtain his patent Content Exclusive of interference twenty nine acres & twenty one perches & allowance of 6 P. & 6
