



Situate formerly in Newbury Township, but now in Fairview Township in the County of York. Containing as above set forth 79 acres and 37 perches and allowance &c. Being part of a larger tract of 359^a & all^{ce} which was originally surveyed on the 20th day of September 1785 by John Forsyth late D.S. for Richard Ashton. In pursuance of a Warrant for 150^a (being one of Samuel Blunston's grants bearing date the 2^d day of May A.D 1734. granted in the name of Richard Cartor. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract of Land the 27th day of April 1805. And now at the request of the present owner Abraham Hursh I am desired to make return of the draught as calculated examined &c. the 18th day of October Anno Domini 1809.
