



A Draught of ninety five acres and one hundred and eight perches of land with six per Cent for roads, which is part of a tract of land formerly in Cumberland county now Armagh township in Mifflin county surveyed the first day of November 1766 in pursuance of an order of survey to James Wilson dated the first day of August 1766 and numbered 308 said to contain 272<sup>9</sup> 119<sup>25</sup>. Resurveyed and divided on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June 1806 as appears by official papers remaining in the Deputy Surveyors Office in Mifflin town in and for the said county of Mifflin. Resurveyed in part and calculated from said official papers 21<sup>st</sup> June A.D. 1811.
