



Situate on the waters of Little Sandy Creek in Wharton township, Fayette County and surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> day of November 1834 in pursuance of a Warrant in the name of Thomas Rose for 400<sup>ac</sup> dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of February 1794. There is two improvements making together 30 or 40 acres 2 log houses, a Barn, apple orchard & the oldest Imp. is from 20 to 30 years old. Also another old Imp. of a few acres, made many years before but not now Occupied
