D. 1825.

The Red lines represent the Surveys made on Comm^{rs} Warrants under which Peter Duey, Henry Jacobs & the heirs of Jacob Ambrister, the present owners and occupiers hold and claim as represented by the dotted lines in the Diagram, the boundaries of the said Comm^{rs} Surveys being the same as the lands held on the app^x as far as it extended ----- and could be ascertained by me on the ground, all which is now reported agreeable to the said contract & the several Acts of Assembly providing for the same
