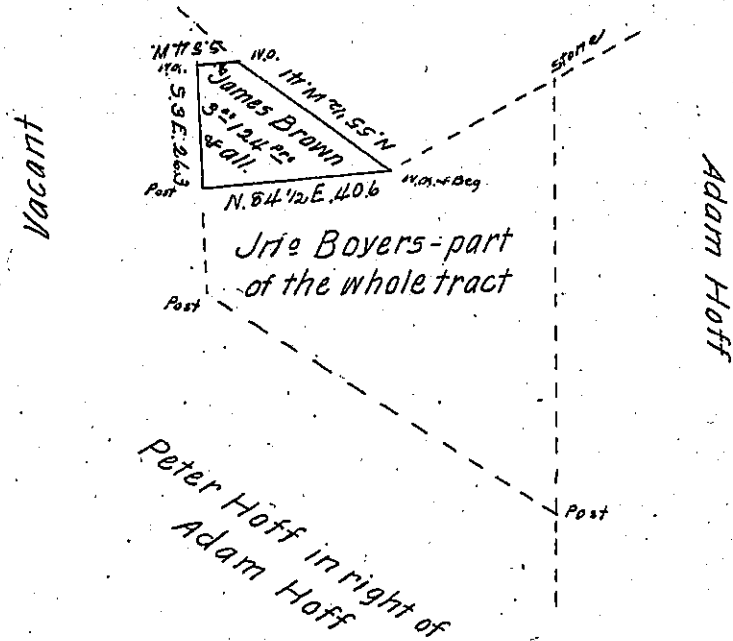


Jacob Garretson's other land  
Joseph Bennet



Situate in Newbury Township York County containing  
as above set forth, three acres, one hundred and twenty four  
perches and allowance of six percent for roads &c. Being part  
of a larger tract of 27<sup>ac</sup> 100<sup>pers</sup> & allowance, originally surveyed by  
Charles Lukens Esq. late D.S. on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1768 in  
pursuance of a Warrant for 25<sup>ac</sup> granted to James Brown  
dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December A.D. 1750. Resurveyed by Jno Eichel-  
berger late D.S. on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March 1803. The above part  
resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day  
of April 1818, for Jacob Garretson the present owner of said part  
at whose request the Draught is examined, found correct and re-  
turned for confirmation.
